Our UNICEF Outright Campaign 2017

During Outright 2017 we heard the story of Paddington Bear.

We thought about refugee children who cannot be reunited with their grandparents, aunt, uncles and siblings. We all think **they** are part of **our** family and refugee children are no different from us.

We asked our pupils and parents at parents night to sign our petition to send to Amber Rudd to try to change the UK law for family reunification. We sent in so it would be received at Parliament on World Children's Day.

Article 10 Government must act quickly and sympathetically if a child or their parents want to live together in the same country. If a child's parents live apart in different countries, the child has the right to visit both of them. **Article 22** If a child is a refugee or is seeking refuge, governments must make sure that they have the same rights as any other child. Governments must help in trying to reunite child refugees with their parents.
