It was national CEOP day on Tuesday and we are marking this event by having our own CEOP and internet safety assembly today. In Struthers we think it is really important to highlight how amazing the internet is, but also how dangerous it can be.

What is CEOP

- * CEOP is an organisation that works with child protection partners across entire world to identify the main threats to children.
- * They protect children from harm both online and offline.

Children of Today – Why we learn about internet safety.

- Children born after 2000:
- 97% play video games
- 80% have mobile phones
- 68% use Instant Messenger/ Instagram/ Facebook
- 75% use internet sites that require personal details

Therefore it is very important to learn about internet safety.

How can I have fun on the computer?

- * You can use your computer for lots of fun things – on and off the internet.
- * One of the exciting things you can do on the internet is to play games, on your own or with people all over the world.
- * Lots of people like to make new friends on the internet but you must NOT share any of your personal information with them.

Chatting Online

- * **When you're chatting to people online, try not to give out any personal information about yourself.**
- * This includes your full name, address or school. It's ok to tell someone what city you live in though as long as you don't include anything else. Even giving a street name can be enough to allow someone to find you. If anyone ever asks you for this information, tell a trusted adult straight away.

Texting

- * **Texting is a great way of staying in touch with friends and family, but sometimes people send nasty messages which can be mean and upsetting.**
- * **It's a good idea not to reply to a nasty message** and if you get a message that upsets you, you should always tell a trusted adult. You should also remember that when you send messages, you should be responsible and not send something that might upset anyone.

Social networking

- * **This is Facebook, Instagram, Twitter etc.**
- * **It's a good idea to use a nickname rather than your real name.**
- * **It's also not a good idea to put your mobile number.**
- * **Use your Privacy Settings!**
- * **Remember they all have age restrictions. (You must be 13 years old)**
- * **Note: Anything you add to your social networking site can be copied or printed, so if you want to put pictures up on your site think before you do it.**

Gaming

- * It's important to remember that it is only a game, and sometimes you will win and sometimes you will lose.
- * Make sure that when you play online games, you don't upset anyone in order to win or get to the next level.
- * It's always best to use a nickname when you are using gaming sites.
- * This includes: YouTube, Minecraft etc.

Cyber Bullying

- * The number one rule to remember if someone is being nasty to you online is to not respond or reply.
- * The second rule is to save all nasty messages and emails.
- * The third rule is to tell a trusted adult. If you tell someone about what's been happening, they will be able to help and maybe stop it.

Being Safe - Top Tips

- * **Always ask a grown up** before you use the internet. They can help you find the best thing to do.
- * **Don't tell strangers** where you live, your phone number or where you go to school.
- * **Don't send pictures** to people you don't know. You don't want strangers looking at photos of you, your friends or your family.
- * **Tell a grown up** if you feel scared or unhappy about anything.

Who can I talk to?

- * If you feel upset about anything you have seen on the computer or if someone has said something which makes you feel bad or funny inside – you need to tell your mum, dad or whoever looks after you at home.
- * You can also talk to your teachers if anything is upsetting you and they will help you.
- * **The most important thing is to remember to tell a grown up you like and trust if you are unhappy or scared about anything.**
