

We were recently awarded our Rights Respecting School Award, Level 1 in December 2014 and are hoping to achieve level 2 in June 2016. This is an essential component of our school's improvement plan. It put the United Nation's Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) as one of the main cores of our school's planning, practice, policies and ethos

The RRSA Committee is led by Mr Haniford and Mrs Boyd. Our committee has children from every stage .

The purpose of our committee is to raise awareness of the rights of the child. This relates to the Improvement Plan because we are aiming to improve rights linked to learning.

Our pupils have become very aware of the United Nations Conventions on the Rights of the Child and all its articles. There are 54 in total. 42 of the articles are for children. The rest are for adults to understand these rights and what their part is in making sure children around the world receive these rights. .

Our pupil committee meet once a month and our steering group consists of pupils, staff, parents and one of our school chaplains.

We have completed our new school charter, lunchtime and playground charters. All classes have created class charters. These are promises to each other and their teachers about carrying out respectful behaviour within the classroom to ensure they receive and allow all other children to receive their rights. Therefore making the learning environments safe, positive, enriching and welcoming.

Over the following year our 'Rights Respecting Ambassadors' will keep you updated with what is going on around the school on this webpage and through special RRS newsletters.

They will also be presenting at assemblies to ensure all children are aware of developments within the school and to continually promote children's rights.



Each class also have their own charter. We try to link our topics and school displays to the articles of the UNCR.

These are promises to each other and their teachers about carrying out respectful behaviour within the classroom to ensure they receive and allow all other children to receive their rights. This helps to make our classrooms safe, positive, enriching and welcoming.



Our pupils have an opportunity to select the person in their class who has shown qualities throughout the week that are on the right path for example they have been helpful, kind, respectful and more. They are awarded the class right pass badge for the week.



Representatives from our RRS Pupil committee also inform our pupils of the Articles which relate to our weekly school assemblies at the start of each assembly. We also have related Articles of the Convention on our weekly parents bulletin and put out seasonal newsletters.

Our behaviour policy and other school policies link to rights and , pupil, parent and staff questionnaires are regularly completed.
