Health and Wellbeing



This term we will continue to focus on friendship as well as thinking about/respecting others and kindness. In addition pupils will be regularly encouraged to set targets and discuss how they are getting on in achieving these targets.

PE – PE days are now a Tuesday (for swimming) and a Thursday. Changing facilities are available, so please could pupils bring their PE kit to school with them on Thursday. This can be stored in class should you wish. We hope to welcome golf sessions from Royal Troon on a Thursday at the earliest possible convenience.

Numeracy & Maths

During term 3 we are planning to cover:

- * 3D Shape
- * Multiplication & Division
- * Fractions
- * Time



We will be utilising both the classroom and outdoor spaces to support and extend learning.

We will also be planning for daily mental maths ensuring that all 4 operations are revisited regularly, improving speed and accuracy. We use a combination of Big Maths, Number Talks and Maths Mastery approaches to deliver mental maths lessons.

Literacy

Reading – Pupils have been allocated books set around the time of WW1. Pupils will complete a variety of activities from our North Lanarkshire Literacy Programme including tasks on setting, character, selecting evidence and summarising. Pupils will also develop their skills in reading unseen texts and answering a variety of higher order questions.

Spelling – In Primary 5 pupils will continue to work through spelling patterns and common tricky words using spelling strategies and simple rules in line with North Lanarkshire Active Literacy.

Writing – Mrs Brearly will continue to support pupils with their weekly 'Big Writing' sessions, developing their skills in narrative writing, report writing through their WW1 history topic and writer's craft.

Pupils will continue to get daily opportunities to write allowing them to practise spellings, handwriting and grammar skills.



Interdisciplinary Learning

Our first topic this term is Scots Language. Pupils will be exploring the poem of Address to the Toothache by Robert Burns as well as looking at Scottish comic strips.

We then move on to our history topic of WW1. Pupils will get the opportunity to make suggestions and shape their topic.
