LEARNING @ HOME

HEALTH & WELLBEING

Our PE slots this term are on a Monday morning and a Thursday afternoon. This term we will be focusing on training for Sports Day! Pupils are given access to the changing rooms beside the gym hall and PE kits can be stored in class. Primary 6 will also be enjoying a 10 week block of swimming every Tuesday morning.

INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING

This term we are focusing on Japan as our IDL topic. Primary 6 will be learning various aspects of Japan, from the geography of the islands, the culture in the country, the style of artwork and the unique technology. We will also be looking at the 'World of Work' later in the term.

NUMERACY AND MATHS

During this term During Term 4 we will be looking at consolidating pupils understanding of Number Processes, Problem Solving and Negative Numbers. Pupils will also work on daily mental maths activities to ensure that all four operations are revisited regularly to improve speed and accuracy. On a Friday, pupils will be challenged through a Mental Maths activity which focuses on the application of different numeracy skills.

LITERACY

This term, pupils will begin Literature Circles. This involves groups focusing on different, more challenging novels. Pupils will work co-operatively to complete tasks whilst also setting the pace at which they read through their novels. This will allow pupils to apply the reading and writing skills they have been working on throughout the year. Mrs Brearley will deliver focused writing lessons each Wednesday in which pupils will develop their skills across a range of genres including report writing and discursive writing based on our topic.
